## General Meeting June 5

**Program presented by Ernesto Sandoval**  
**"A Baja California Natural History: the Land of the**

**Boojum**



Having traveled to the northern half of the Baja California peninsula, Ernesto Sandoval, Director of the UC Davis Botanical Conservatory hopes to convince us to travel to this particular flavor of the Sonoran Desert, at least vicariously through his presentation if not at some future date. He has visited the peninsula during three particularly moist springs, including the 1998 El Niño, and at least 10 winters. Learn about some botanically defining characteristics of the peninsula's plant life as well as the endemic and near endemic plants, especially succulents, that are found throughout Baja. Ernesto has amassed a visually stunning collection of images from this remarkable landscape, known to some as one of the most lush deserts in the world.

Ernesto Sandoval's horticultural home is the Botanical Conservatory at UC Davis, where he has worked his way up from waterer and weeder in 1991 to Director. His botanical home away from home is Baja California. He's been traveling there since his first intrepid visit in 1995 with vehicles from Wrent-a-Wreck and a AAA map. Today it's University vehicles and a much better knowledge of beautiful and interesting locations for camping and seeing some of the Peninsula's fascinating flora and special succulents. As field trip organizer for the UC Davis Botany Club, he's led many trips to Baja California over the winter break and three during lush and moist spring breaks. The beer and the beaches are the minor distractions of these trips to see the plethora of plants — whether succulent and spiny or flowering and fighting for survival — in one of the most amazing portions of the Sonoran Desert. Ernesto hopes to, at least, convince people to visit an amazing desert that most tourists see as a 1000 kilometer wasteland with tropical beaches at its southern tip and great fishing. Be prepared to be splendidly spun into the web of desert life, Baja style.

Ernesto will also bring an assortment of less common succulents for sale as part of the UC Davis Botanical Conservatory's Green for Green program.
